

# Crochet Rose PATTERN

## Materials:

Red worsted weight (4) yarn

Green worsted weight (4) yarn

5mm crochet hook

Gardening wire

Pliers

Hot glue gun

Yarn needle

## Abbreviations:

Chain: ch

Stitch: st

Slip stitch: ss

Single crochet: sc

Half double crochet: hdc

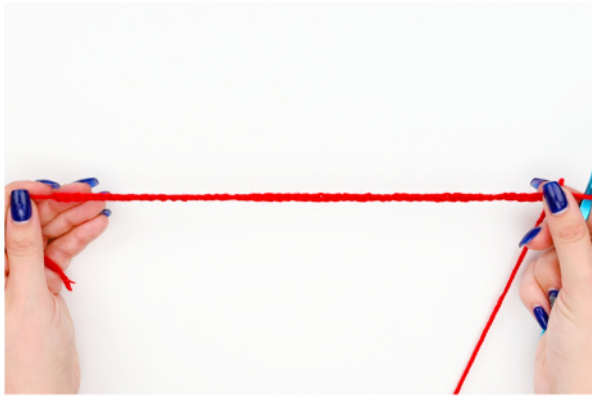
Double crochet: dc

Triple crochet: tc

## Pattern Notes:

- 1 The easiest way to adjust your rose size is to increase the yarn and/or hook size
- 2 You can use any kind of glue to attach the stem at the end. We recommend either hot glue or fabric glue, but super glue works well too.

# Crochet Rose



1

Ch 50 with the red yarn.



2

Insert 1 sc into the 2nd chain from the hook, and then into each st across.



3

Ch 4 (counts as 1 dc and 2 chains), then insert 1 dc into the 1st stitch (right next to the chain 4).



4

Ch 1, and skip the next 2 sts.

Insert 1 dc into the following stitch.

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5

Ch 2 and insert 1 dc into the same stitch.



6

Repeat this pattern all the way across.

(Ch 1, skip 2 sts, 1 dc into following stitch, ch 2, 1 DC into same st.)

End your row with a single dc in the last stitch.



7

Insert 1 sc into the "ch 1" space from the last row.



8

Insert 8 dc into the "ch 2" space between the dc from the last row.

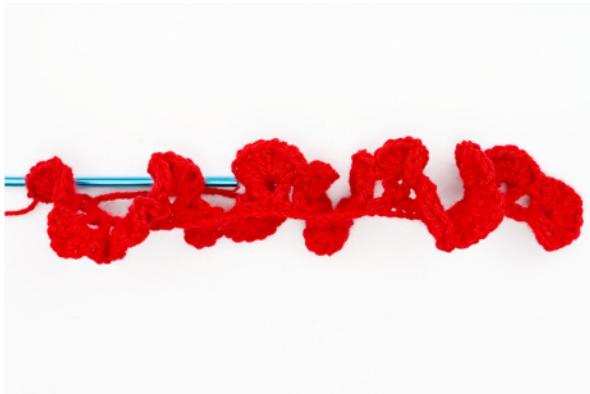

Repeat 7 more times, for a total of 8 "8 dc" clusters with a sc between them.



10

Insert a sc in the "ch 1" space followed by 12 dc into the "chain 2" space.



11

Continue the 12 dc clusters (with a sc in between) to the end.



12

Cut and tie off your yarn.

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13

Cut a piece of yarn about 12" long and tie it to the right side of your rose (the end without any tails).



14

Assemble your rose by rolling it up and sewing the base together as you go.



15

To begin the leaf, ch 10 with the green yarn.



16

Insert the following stitches into each chain across, starting with the 2nd chain from the hook:

Ss, sc, hdc, dc, tc, dc, hdc, dc, ss.

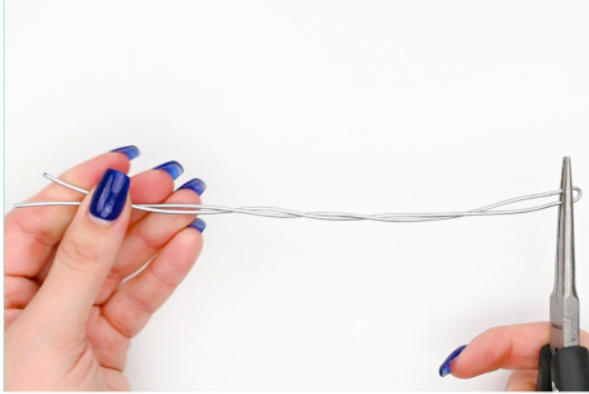

17

Cut and tie off, leaving a 6" tail.

Repeat steps 15-17 two more times for a total of three leaves.



18

Cut a piece of gardening wire to be about 16", fold it in half, and twist it around itself.



19

Starting from the folded end, wrap green yarn (the same colour as the leaves) around the wire.



20

Tie off the yarn when you get to the top, leaving about 0.5" of exposed wire. This unwrapped end will stick into the rose.

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21

Use the long tails on each leaf to sew them onto the bottom of the rose.



22

Tie and cut all your tails. They shouldn't unravel, as you'll be adding glue in the next step.



23

Add a generous amount of glue onto the bottom center of the rose.



24

Stick the uncovered end of the stem into the glue and rose.

Cut off any ends.
