

Loom Knitting Hat PATTERN

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Materials:

Round loom
Loom hook
Yarn needle
Yarn (in the best size
for your loom)
Scissors

Pattern Notes:

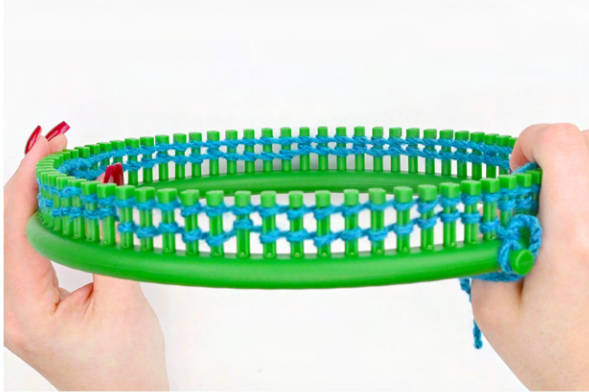
- 1 We used a Bulky (5) yarn and a large loom with 72 pegs closer together. You may need to use a thicker yarn if you use a loom with 36 pegs.
- 2 To make a smaller/bigger hat, choose a different loom size.

Cast on by going around the loom clockwise, and wrapping the yarn around each peg counter-clockwise.

When you reach the beginning, wrap each peg a 2nd time (in the same direction) so that you have 2 loops on each peg.

Using your loom hook, lift the bottom loop over and off the top of the peg. This will leave you with one loop on the peg. Do this all the way around the loom.

This is the knit stitch.

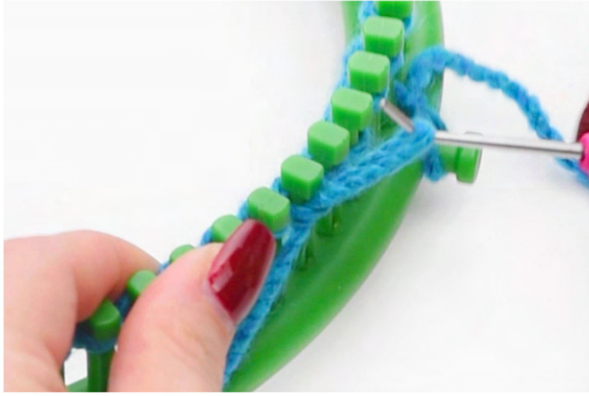

Now you'll do a purl stitch. Using your working yarn, pull it across the 1st peg and below the loop already on the peg.

Put your loom hook through the loop on the peg from the top.

Pull the working yarn through the top loop, making a larger loop.

Hold the new loop with your fingers and use the hook to pull the other loop off of the peg.

Then put the loop you're holding onto the peg. Repeat all the way around.

For the next round, do a knit stitch. Same as casting on, wrap the yarn around each peg, counter-clockwise around the peg, but clockwise around the loom.

Using your loom hook, pull the bottom loop over the top loop, and off the peg. Repeat all the way around.

Repeat the pattern, alternating the rows between knit and purl stitches five times (or until your work is about 1.5" long). This is the cuff of the hat.

Now that the cuff is complete, repeat the knit stitch until your work is about 8" long (or however long you want your hat to be).

Cut your yarn, leaving about a 12" tail and thread the tail through the yarn needle.

One peg at a time, use your loom hook and lift the loop off the peg. While holding the loop on the hook, thread the needle through the loop. Move to the next peg and repeat. Continue all the way around.

Once all the loops are off the loom and on the tail, pull your tail tightly to gather all the loops together, closing off your hat. Tie it off to secure it, but do not cut the yarn yet.

Acquire or make a pom pom using your favourite technique. Sew the tail through the pom pom and hat, securing it to the top of the hat.

Use your yarn needle to tie in your ends.
