

Crochet Daisy PATTERN

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Materials:

Worsted weight yarn:
white, green, and yellow

5mm crochet hook

Gardening wire

Yarn needle

Pliers/wire cutters

Hot glue

Scissors

Abbreviations:

Chain: ch

Stitch: st

Slip stitch: ss

Single crochet: sc

Half-double crochet: hdc

Double crochet: dc

Triple crochet: tc

Pattern Notes:

- 1 To make a smaller or more realistic looking daisy, use a lighter weight yarn and a smaller hook size.
- 2 You can omit the stem and simply make the daisy, which can be turned into keychains, pins, hair clips, and more.

Crochet Daisy



1

Starting with the yellow yarn, slip knot and ch 2.



2

Insert 12 sc into the 1st chain. Ss into the first st. Cut and tie off.



3

Repeat steps 1 and 2, but leave an 8" tail on the 2nd circle.



4

Insert your hook into any st on the 1st circle and change to white yarn.

Ch 6.



6
Starting with the 2nd ch from the hook, insert the following sts across the chs:
Ss, sc, dc, dc, sc.



7
Ss into the next st on the yellow circle. This completes the first petal.



8
Repeat steps 5-7 until you have 12 petals (11 more times).



9

Ss into the bottom of the first petal. Cut and tie off your yarn.



10

Using the green yarn, slip knot and chain 10.

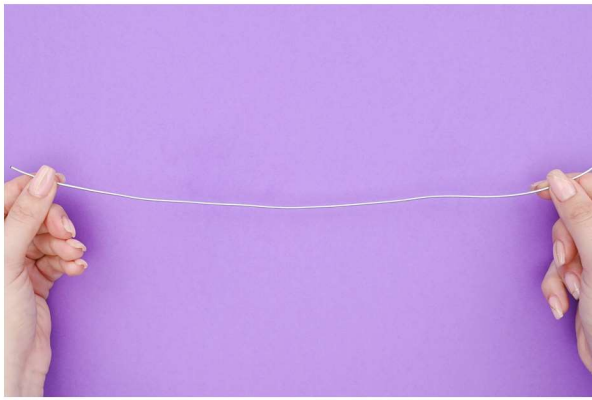
Insert the following sts into the chs across, starting with the 2nd ch from the hook:

Ss, sc, hdc, dc, tc, dc, hdc, sc, ss.



12

Cut and tie off, leaving a 4" tail.



13

Cut a 12" piece of gardening wire.



14

Fold the wire in half and twist it around itself to form the daisy's stem.



15

Wrap the wire in green yarn, starting at the folded end.



16

Cut the yarn when you get about 1/4" from the end. Use pliers to secure the yarn, pushing the 2 wire ends together.



17

Sew the 2nd yellow circle to the back of the daisy, leaving a small gap for the stem to go through.



18

Put a small amount of hot glue on the top of the stem (the part with exposed wire). Push the stem into the daisy, between the gap in the yellow circle.



19

Wrap the tails of the leaf around the stem tightly. Sew them into the leaf to secure.



20

Sew in and cut your ends.
