Monogram Crochet Coasters PATTERN





Materials:

100% cotton yarn (2 contrasting colours)

4 mm crochet hook

Graph pattern (Find all 26 letters on our website!)

Yarn needle

Abbreviations:

Chain: ch

Stitch(es): st(s)

Single crochet: sc

Double crochet: dc

Pattern Notes:

- 1 For this pattern, the grey yarn will be known as "colour A" and the blue yarn as "colour B".
- 2 Ideally, keep all your tails on the back side of your coaster so that you have a clear "right side" and "wrong side". This will make the "right side" look much neater.
- Wisit our website linked below to find free graphs for all 26 letters of the alphabet.
- This pattern will walk you through the first few rows of the letter "D" step by step, before switching to a row by row format. For other letters, follow the graph and basic concept of this pattern.

Start by re-rolling your yarn into smaller balls of yarn. This will allow you to easily work on the different sections.



2

Starting with colour A, make a slip knot and ch 18.



3

Row 1:

Insert 1 dc into each ch, starting at the 3rd ch from the hook (a total of 16 dcs across).



4

Row 2:

Turn your work and ch 2. Work 1 dc into each of the first 6 sts.





5 Cut colour A.



6

Attach a strand of colour B and insert 1 dc into each of the next 8 sts.



7

Drop colour B and attach a new strand of colour A. Insert 1 dc into each of the last 2 sts.


Row 3:

Turn your work and ch 2. Work 1 dc into each of the first 2 sts.





Drop colour A and pick up colour B. Insert 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.



10

Drop colour B and attach a strand of colour A. Insert 1 dc into each of the next 6 sts.



11

Cut colour A and attach a strand of colour B. Insert 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.



Cut colour B and attach a strand of colour A. Insert 1 dc into each of the last 4 sts.











Continue to follow the graph and flip your work after each row. Proceed with colour changes as you did before, switching and cutting the yarn when necessary.

For Row 4, insert the following sts:

Colour A: Ch 2, 1 dc into each of the first 2 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the next 8 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the last 2 sts.

Row 5:

Colour A: Ch 2, 1 dc into each of the first 2 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the next 8 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the last 2 sts.

Row 6:

Colour A: Ch 2, 1 dc into each of the first 2 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the next 8 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the last 2 sts.

Row 7:

Colour A: Ch 2, 1 dc into each of the first 2 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.


Colour A: 1 dc into each of the next 8 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the last 2 sts.









Row 8:

Colour A: Ch 2, 1 dc into each of the first 4 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the next 6 sts.

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 2 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the last 2 sts.

Row 9:

Colour A: Ch 2, 1 dc into each of the first 2

Colour B: 1 dc into each of the next 8 sts.

Colour A: 1 dc into each of the last 6 sts.

19

Row 10:

Insert 1 dc into each st across.

20

Cut and tie off your yarn.





Add a border of your choosing. We inserted 1 sc into each st around the perimeter, with each corner having 2 sc, 1 ch, 2 sc. Finish your border with a slip stitch into the first sc.



22

Use a yarn needle to tie in all your ends on the back.
